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Another Phenomenal Year of Growth

For the first time since Hatua began, we awarded scholarships to students from across the entire county of Mombasa. We sponsored a total of 585 students this year and graduated 48 from college & university (which we refer to as 'tertiary'). Of our 190 alumni, 93% have joined the workforce within one year of graduating.

In 2022 we piloted our redesigned high school mentoring curriculum, introduced our gap year students to entrepreneurship using human centered design, and launched our tertiary mentoring eLearning program. Our network of libraries expanded as well. We opened our second community library, and hosted over half a million visits across our 11 libraries in Likoni, Mvita and Nyali.

These milestones would not have been possible without the support of our partners, the commitment of our volunteer mentors, the engagement of our alumni, and the dedication of our incredible team. Thank you all for being a vital part of this life changing work and for making 2022 a phenomenal year of growth.

With his keen eye for organizational systems, Twalib has designed and implemented a digital attendance system that has increased efficiency and reduced costs across the company's 65 branches.






Hatua Now Serves All of Mombasa County

For the first time Hatua awarded scholarships to students from across all of Mombasa. We conducted outreach to **87** public primary schools, received **1,031** applications and welcomed **98** new students into our program, including **50** from Kisauni, Jomvu, Nyali, and Changamwe — the new subcounties we serve. In total we educated **333** high school students in 2022.

45 Hatua students successfully graduated from high school and joined colleges or universities, bringing our total number of tertiary students to **252**. Overall, **90%** of all students who have joined Hatua have completed their tertiary education or are ongoing in our program.





Hatua Launches New Mentoring Curriculum

In 2022 we piloted **6** of our newly developed secondary mentoring units, which help students cultivate the key mindsets and skills of communication, collaboration, emotional intelligence, problem solving and responsibility. Our mentoring curriculum embeds these skills within activity-based lessons focused on themes such as career choice, healthy relationships, digital literacy and community service.




Our final 3 units are developed and ready to pilot in January 2023. Thereafter, we will complete final revisions before digitizing all of our secondary mentoring content and making it available open-source to nonprofits and schools that wish to integrate soft skills into their programs.





Gap Years Promote Peace Ahead of Elections

Our Gap Year program focused on two unique activities in 2022 - Civic Education Outreach and Entrepreneurship. In addition to our usual mentoring modules, students learned how to use a human-centered approach to design business solutions for everyday problems in our community. Working in teams over 2 months, students developed and pitched 9 viable business ideas.

We also partnered with Uraia Trust and the Danish Embassy to conduct civic education outreach and promote peace during the 2022 general elections. Our students did this by screening the movie 'Ni Sisi' at high schools and movie cafes, then facilitating discussions on why and how to promote peace. They also led two peace rallies.

Hatua's Tertiary Mentoring Goes Digital

Unlimited, we successfully rolled out 7
soft skills eLearning courses on
Moodle, an online learning platform.
219 students are enrolled in courses on
Time Management, Leading Self,
Leading Others, and Budgeting &



Hatua Alumni Now Total 190

48 Hatua students graduated in 2022 bringing our total number of alumni to 190. Of those who graduated more than one year ago, 93% are engaged in the workforce, earning an average monthly income of \$305, which is 5X the international poverty line and over 3X the average total household income of their parents.

Among our alumni, **96%** are using their resources, including money, time, knowledge, and networks, to help other marginalized youth access opportunities. We are particularly excited to have **20** Hatua alumni providing career mentoring to our tertiary students.



Over 500,000 Library Visits in 2022

2022 was the best year yet for our Library programs. We opened our second community library, in Nyali, where we launched all of our library programs. We hosted **over half a million visits** across our 11 libraries, conducted over **2,000** Read Aloud sessions serving over **6,000** students, and facilitated **10** book club discussions.

To help youth gain exposure to 21st century technologies we continued our Digital Literacy Program and launched a new Python coding course at our Likoni Community Library. 146 youth successfully completed this course in 2022. In total, we hosted over 12,000 computer lab visits this year.





New Hatua team members in 2022


